## ...And the fiber-to-the-home construction continues

Just when PTCI's hard-working construction crews thought it might be time for a rest, the work orders arrived for the next phase of PTCI's multi-year, fiber-to-the-home projects.

It's an exciting time at PTCI, with a fiber-optic network growing throughout the Oklahoma Panhandle as each day goes by. Crews completed construction in Hooker before the end of 2019 and have begun burying fiber in Texhoma. Boise City will be next in line for construction, likely in the 2020-2021 timeframe.

While all this is going on, PTCI has also started a "Rural Surge" project to build a fiber-optic network to as many farms and ranches in the Oklahoma Panhandle as possible given PTCI's strategic initiative plans. This "Rural Surge" will continue for the next five-to-seven years.

So what does all this fiber mean to you? It means internet speeds up to one gigabit, which is up to 1,000 times faster than what most people are using today. It means you can stream your TV shows with no buffering, while the kids are gaming, and mom is uploading photos for grandma to view.

## Be on guard for tech support scams

Here's how it works: Scammers may use popup ads claiming to sell fixes for your computer, which lead you to a website to download the software. You're told to call to "register" the software, and if you do, you'll be asked for remote access to your computer. Using remote access, they "examine"



your computer and say it has problems needing additional "solutions." Next they want your credit card number to purchase these so-called solutions, often leading to credit card fraud.

Alternatively, some scammers call and claim they're on the tech support team at Microsoft or another well-known technology company. They go through the same process of accessing your computer, getting credit card or other information, and causing trouble.

#### Follow these tips to avoid being scammed:

- Never give access to your computer to someone who calls you out of the blue.
- Never provide credit card information or other sensitive data to someone claiming to be a tech support representative.

PTCl wants you to stay informed and vigilant so you can outsmart the scammers.
