Vintage Leopard

Holly McLanahan was just trying to help her daughter make some money the summer before heading off to college. What it turned into was an online boutique that's been voted top in Texas.

"We started back in 2012, really by accident," said Holly McLanahan, owner of the Vintage Leopard. "I purchased items here and there for her to sell online in a local, for-sale group page that she could deliver to customers and make some money. A friend asked if I could get a particular tennis shoe. I searched and searched and finally found it. We started selling it. I didn't want to take up all the for-sale groups on Facebook, so I started a page and included the shoe. It went crazy from there."

Where the craziness went? That was selling 2,500 pairs of that one tennis shoe — all of this while McLanahan still had a full-time job away from her burgeoning online business.

"I didn't have time during the day to devote to this. So, I needed a website where people could go and purchase the shoe on their own without personal involvement from me," McLanahan said.

As the business grew to a place where it could be a full-time endeavor, the relationships became the native Canadian's favorite part of the business.

McLanahan said, "The best part about having an online boutique is being able to connect with people in different aspects. It works great for me because I can still live in this small hometown that I love, and do what I want to do. It's the kind of business you can do from anywhere, and this is where we love to be. It's our home."

3 tech resolutions to make in 2022

Upload speed is important to video call quality

When you're on a video call — whether via Zoom, Skype, or another app — your internet connection plays a role in the quality of that experience. In particular, a too-slow upload speed can cause delays, awkward frozen screens, and broken audio.

Why is this the case? During a video call, you are downloading the other people's video and simultaneously uploading video from your camera. Similar to how your download speed affects picture and sound quality when streaming a show on your TV, your upload speed affects how others see and hear you on the other end of your video call.

If other participants in a video call say, "You're breaking up," or "I can't hear you," you may be able to quickly solve the issue by turning off your video or switching to a wired connection. Moving forward, however, you'll want to consider signing up for the next-higher internet tier, which will likely increase both your download and upload speeds.

Cold-weather care for mobile devices

Smartphones and tablets don't like cold weather. When a lithium-ion battery is exposed to low temperatures, it can drain faster than normal or indicate it has ample power remaining and then suddenly go dead. Low temperatures can also make a device's glass surfaces more sensitive to cracks and breaks.

To keep your device from getting too cold, don't leave it for long in frigid places such as a parked car. It's best to stash it inside pockets closest to your person, where it can absorb some of your body heat. In the event your device does shut down, don't restart it until you're inside and have given it time to warm up. Restarting immediately could actually cause more harm and shorten your battery life.
